Sustainable development




- Major shift in development

CCD and the development context


- Stagnation in development indicators in sub-Saharan Africa
- Challenging and relatively unchanged development context
- High variation in local development issues and ecosystem services across landscapes

What should CCD be about?

- Increasing local ownership and decision-making in development
- Catalyzing viable economies across landscapes
- Improving the capacity of communities and institutions to collaborate, plan and implement development strategies





What should CCD not be about?



- Stating the obvious
- Ignoring existing power relations underlying how the development agenda is defined
- Achieving consensus on what CCD means
- Just carbon




Conclusion
