

# Are there any particular opportunities, barriers and/or limit?

- High Transaction costs of REDD (funding)
- Will REDD benefits offset the opportunity costs of conserving the forest?
- How do you address leakage?
- What is the right methodology?
- There are many drivers of deforestation how do you find alternatives to all drivers?
- There are competing agendas (eg. Kilimo Kwanza)
- How do you adequately and fairly inform communities about REDD?
- REDD payments will take time before it reaches communities
- Communities have high expectations about REDD funds
- Poor gender equity
- Lack of institutional capacity
- Lack of Cost and benefit sharing mechanism

- The freedom of media






# What are the current opportunities and gaps presented by policy for CCD?.....



- Decentralization
- Poor law enforcement.
- The freedom of media
- Disconnect between policy and implementation.
- There is high priority (Education, Water, Health and Agriculture) vs other sectors



# Policy Matters...



- Secure and strengthen lend tenure at the community level and ensure that carbon tenure is tied to land tenure
- Benefits, including income, of REDD+ must reach communities directly. The financing mechanism would benefit from being more clear should be structured in a way that will favor communities.
- Tanzania should prioritize and commit to adopting high social and environmental safeguards that are monitored and regulated.
- There should be clear regulations on benefit sharing and management agreements between communities and government.
- There needs to be more involvement from other sectors so as to not have conflicting policies and agendas.
- Civil society should be involved in the decision making process
